We will also have representatives of the NSW Department of Planning Industry and Environment | Water and others.

The Annual Dinner address will feature a presentation of the NGV's 'Homily to Country 2020' by French artist JR.

At this year's Annual General Meeting, motions to be considered include consistent metering and telemetry across the Basin jurisdictions; end of system and valley specific flow targets to restore the health of the Darling River; and support for the increase in representation of First Nations people on local government and in water policy.
