

MDA Delegates Report

January 2022

The Murray Darling Association (MDA) is Australia's peak body representing local government across the Murray-Darling Basin.

The following report should be tabled at council and provides delegates and their councils with an overview of MDA activities and engagements.



A note from the Murray Darling Association National President:

The months of December and January have been busy, and quite unusual with respect to Basin weather conditions.

NSW saw its local government elections held on 4th December with 51 candidates in the Albury LGA. The poll was declared on 20th December, and I was re-elected with a term of office of 2 years and 9 months with elections again in September 2024.

With Spring and early summer having shaped up to be quite wet, and December and January being characterised by violent storms, with subsequent minor local flooding and significant crop damage.

After the disruptions of Covid and the delayed elections in 2020 and 2021, the region 1 AGM was delayed and will now occur in the first week of March.


5. Region Meetings
