


Commonwealth water for the environment

Discussing conditions in the Edward-Kolety Wakool – the Millennium Drought went from 2001 to 2009.




Celebrating the extended Renmark Irrigation Trust infrastructure being turned on to water Bookmark Creek floodplain, SA.










