7. Basin Communities Leadership Program

In March, we were able to fulfil our commitment regarding The Basin Community Leadership Program (BCLP) with Face-to-Face Workshops in a COVID-19-safe environment.

The details are as follows: participants completed the MDA Academy Online Training prior to attending the face-to-Face workshops. The Online Academy covers five modules including: Leadership Theory; Water Literacy and Communicating with Impact.

The MDA worked in partnership with LGA's to support the community, boost the local economy and encourage trade in small businesses. Whilst we have completed the proposed workshops as planned, there is potential to conduct further workshops with targeted community groups.
