Balancing neutrality, productivity and sustainability

DO you want to have your say on the 450-gigalitre water recovery target?

Are you satisfied with how the Murray-Darling Basin Plan defines socioeconomic neutrality?

Are you interested in understanding how some of Australia's biggest irrigators manage their water holdings?

These issues and many more will be discussed at the Murray Darling Association's 74th National Conference and Annual General Meeting, occurring at the Leeton Soldiers Club from Wednesday, August 29 to Friday, August 31.

Conversations on these matters will be led by industry leaders, decision makers and authorities who play a key role in Basin management.

University of Canberra Associate Professor, Dr Jacki Schirmer and CSIRO Principal Research Scientist, Dr Cathy Robinson will talk about the needs for understanding socio-economic impacts, the complexity of achieving good assessment, and the opportunities that can emerge from achieving an agreed definition of neutral, positive and negative socio-economic impacts in the context of Basin Plan implementation.

"Socio-economic impact assessment is hard, and one of the challenges is that views about what is a 'good' or 'bad' social outcomes often aren't defined before an assessment occurs," Dr Schirmer said.

"It is critical for a wide range of stakeholders to come together to agree on what it means to have neutral socio-economic impact for the implementation of the next stages of the Basin Plan."

Dr Schirmer and Dr Robinson's presentation will set the scene for audience members to contribute to an interactive session focusing on the 450-gigalitre water recovery target, hosted by Skillset Environment Senior Manager, Ashley Bland.

Delegates will also hear from Brendan Barry, Webster Ltd General Manager for Water, along with representatives from other major irrigation industries, such as cotton, rice and walnut production, regarding balancing agricultural productivity and sustainability.

Other highlights include a Civic Reception Night Glow on the Wednesday night at the Leeton Jockey Club and a Murrumbidgee Riverina Region study tour on the Friday, which will see delegates visit a number of industries and irrigation infrastructure assets.
